

<b>REPORT FROM COMPS</b>
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The Comps Committee has met once since the last executive meeting, at St. Andrews on the 23<sup>rd</sup> March. An entertaining game of Disc golf was played after the meeting and the Chair lost badly. Below is a summary of the main ‘headlines’.

**Conference Cup Update**

With the exception of Rugby, all Conference Cup Finals took place at Dundee University on Wednesday 24th March. The event was a great success largely down to Paul and his team at Dundee. The aim is to try and have all the cup finals in a similar format next year as all the athletes involved really enjoyed it.

**SDC Title**

There has been small discussions surrounding the title “SDC” and it was felt that this title is no longer appropriate for the current SDC’s roles. A decision was made to use the title “Chair” and focus more on the development groups that now run a lot of the sports.

**Online Survey tool**

Comps have requested SUS that an online survey tool is purchased so that necessary feedback can be returned regarding certain events such as Home Nations, Cup finals and general league involvement. It is hoped that this feedback will further allow the group to improve its delivery of events.

**Performance Booklet**

Comps have put together a Performance Booklet on behalf of all its members. The Booklet contains what each university offers in terms of Scholarships and the necessary information surrounding each Universities Scholarship system. Big thanks have to go to Gary Brankin and Jenny Durkin for compiling this.

**Events Planner**

The events planner is now at a stage where several Universities have bought into it and most of the SDC’s are happy with it. Following some final amendments it will be circulated one last time and the aim is to roll it out at Conference. It would be good to have the buy in of executive on the Events Planners aims. Once the planner goes out at conference the idea is that exact dates would be given to each University by September 1<sup>st</sup>. Only big issue surrounding planner is the free will agreement and some unis subsidising other universities.

**Coaching database**

Some time has been spent by Claire Cruickshank looking into how each university manages their coaches. The findings are that this is an area that is very poorly managed and is something comps are looking into supporting Universities with. Coach education, linking with NGBs and educating unis as to why they should know who is coaching are areas that comps will be focusing on.

**Fixtures 2010/11**

Planning for next years fixtures scheduling has begun and term dates have been collected from all the universities. Certain issues this year such as extra team entries and withdrawals were discussed and comps are going to have an amber light system to make sure the same problems do not occur this year. Also a new approach is being discussed to solve un played fixture issues for next season.
